

Joint Engagement Equality Objectives Implementation Plan – Calderdale, Greater Huddersfield & North Kirklees CCGs - April 2018 – March 2022

Our equality objectives were developed based on the outcome of our Equality Delivery System (EDS2) in 2017. The aim of having objectives is to be able to make service improvements with a focus on particular equality groups.

The objectives for 2018/2022 are:

- Equality objective 1: Improve access to GP Practices for specific equality groups
 - ° Years 1 & 2 LGBT & young people
 - ° Years 3 & 4 BME & Carers
- Equality Objective 2: Improve engagement with specific equality groups:
 - ° Years 1 & 2 LGBT & young people
 - Years 3 & 4 BME & Carers
- Equality Objective 3: Improve governance processes for equality

Our equality objectives have been designed to be delivered over a four year period, with progress reported annually, they will be delivered through the action plan below. The plan will be overseen by project groups established to support implementation. Progress will be monitored through quarterly reports to the Quality Committee.

Progress update for 2019-20

There has been substantial progress on delivering the actions for Equality Objectives 1 and 2 this year. The engagement team worked with VAC and Barnardo's Positive Identities Service to co-design a survey targeted at young people aged 12-25. The engagement was piloted in Calderdale and ran from 29 April to 17 June 2019. We worked closely with young people to produce a range of creative reporting methods. These included a Lego Stop Motion film to highlight good/poor practice in GP practices, a film with the voices of young people sharing their experiences and an infographic to feedback the results of the survey to peers. All the above work was showcased at the Steering Group and has been recognised by the LGBT Foundation, who are putting it forward for recognition as best practice at their National Programme Board. A proposal will be made to the Steering Group for practices to review the films and reports and see where they can implement the recommendations to improve the experience of children and young people when visiting GP practices. A 'mystery shopper' exercise in a years' time has been proposed to review whether any improvements have made in GP practices in light of the report recommendations.

The young people's survey is currently being rolled out across Kirklees and a survey for adults has been rolled out in Calderdale; this will be replicated in Kirklees in April/May 2020. The LGBT Foundation 'Pride in Practice' accreditation has been offered to all GPs in Calderdale and Kirklees free of charge until the end of March 2020. The Blackburn Road Medical Centre is the first GP practice in Kirklees to receive the Gold Pride in Practice Award.

Detailed action plans to support delivery of the objectives have been developed in partnership with the multi-agency steering group, which is driving implementation across the Calderdale, Greater Huddersfield and North Kirklees CCGs footprints. A more detailed progress update on each of the actions can be found below:
